### STEP ONE: ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students must meet the Practical Nursing program admission requirements and be accepted into the program prior to enrollment in PNE courses. Students are assigned to the Health Technology – Pre-Nursing Certificate until admitted into & start clinical nursing courses.

(If a student has successfully completed MTE 1-5 in the last five years, MDE 10 is not required). Deficiencies must be completed prior to submitting program application. ## STEP TWO: APPLY TO THE PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAM

After completing the admission requirements above, submit a practical nursing application during the published application period. The next application period will be <u>February 10-14, 2025</u> for the class beginning May, 2025.
 Applications for the PN program must be completed on the P&HCC website during the designated application period. The application will be considered incomplete without required official transcripts being submitted to the Admissions Office (admissions@patrickhenry.edu).

#### AFTER APPLICATION SUBMISSION

• Completed applications will be processed following the posted application deadline and *qualified applicants* will be invited to take the timed admission test.

\*Qualified applicants are those that meet STEP ONE and STEP TWO as outlined above.

# **ADMISSION TESTING**

• Applicants must have satisfactory scores in reading, English & language usage, science and mathematics. \*Optional Pre-Admission TEAS test book "ATI TEAS Study Manual,7th Edition ISBN #978-565332393. Web Information available: http://www.testprepreview.com/teas\_practice.htm. This book is also on closed reserve in the LRC.

#### **ADMISSION NOTES**

- Priority admission will be given to those who score 60% or higher on the TEAS entrance exam.
- All students must complete a criminal background check. Applicants who have committed a felony/misdemeanor may not be offered admission. The Board of Nursing may deny any application for licensure if the applicant has committed a felony/misdemeanor under laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia of the United States.
- Students must take and pass a drug screening test prior to starting clinical nursing courses. A positive drug screening test will prohibit students from starting clinical nursing courses.
- Students who are accepted to the program must participate in mandatory patient care clinical experiences and proof of the COVID-19 vaccine or a waiver request for exemption is currently required by clinical agencies.
- The Patrick & Henry Community College Practical Nursing Certificate Program has been granted full approval by the Virginia Board of Nursing. (<a href="https://www.dhp.virginia.gov/Boards/Nursing">https://www.dhp.virginia.gov/Boards/Nursing</a>)

Students will be assigned to the Health Technology – Pre-Nursing Certificate until they are accepted into and start the clinical practical nursing courses. After completing the appropriate developmental classes if needed, the student may enroll in the following courses while waiting admission to the practical nursing program.
