STEP ONE: PRE-APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

The following must be complete (not in progress) prior to application submission:

- Current P&HCC student application
- Evidence of High School Graduation or GED; High School Seniors may apply. Official copies of high school and college transcripts must be provided to the Admissions Office (<u>admissions@patrickhenry.edu</u>). Many schools use <u>www.parchment.com</u> to send transcripts.
- Evidence of High School Biology and Chemistry with a grade of C or higher; or college equivalent
 Biology (BIO 101/102 or NAS 150) Grade: _____Chemistry (CHM 110/101/05/111) Grade: _____
- Evidence of high school algebra I and II with a grade of C or higher. If five years have passed since high school completion and no history of college level math course with a grade of C or higher, students must successfully complete MDE 10 prior to applying to the program. (If a student has successfully completed MTE 1-5 in the last five years, MDE 10 is not required). Deficiencies must be completed prior to submitting program application.

____MTE: 1 2 3 4 5 ____MDE 10 ____HS Alg. 1 & 2 with C or higher (HS courses must be < 5 years old)

- Student placement in ENG 111 or ENG 111/EDE 11. *Deficiencies must be completed prior to submitting program application.*
- Student has attended an ADN Program Information Session prior to application submission. The attendance date may be no longer than <u>6 months</u> from the application period.

STEP THREE: APPLY TO THE NURSING PROGRAM DURING THE POSTED APPLICATION PERIOD *You must complete STEP ONE and STEP TWO for your application to be complete.*

- Pre-application requirements complete
- Concurrent enrollment in: BIO 141, BIO 142, ENG 111, SDV 100, MTH 155, and PSY 230 (if not already complete)
- Curricular GPA of 2.5 or higher <u>AND</u> minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Official transcripts must be submitted with the application even if course transfer credits have been processed
- Current Unrestricted VA LPN License

AFTER APPLICATION SUBMISSION

• Completed applications will be processed following the posted application deadline and <u>qualified applicants</u> will be invited to take the timed admission test.

*Qualified applicants are those that meet STEP ONE and STEP TWO as outlined above.

ADMISSION TESTING

- Beginning in the spring 2023 application period, <u>the ATI TEAS entrance exam will be used</u>. Areas of assessment include science, math, reading, and English and language usage.
- ATI suggests the following preparatory text: 2022-2023 Official ATI TEAS Study Manual, Aligned to the new ATI TEAS Version 7 Blueprint, ISBN 978-565332393. <u>https://atitesting.com/teas/study-manual</u>. This book is available for purchase online or on closed reserved in the LRC.

ADMISSION NOTES

- Admission testing will be offered to students meeting the pre-application and pre-requisite requirements. Students
 who score at or above the 50th percentile rank score on the TEAS exam (66 or higher overall score) and earn a science
 score of 51.1% or higher will move to step two of the admission process. At step two, students will be scored using a
 rubric which awards points for: cumulative GPA, pre-admission science performance, TEAS overall score, specified TEAS
 category scores, course success and status of residence. Refer to the ADN Admission Scoring Rubric located on the ADN

- All students must complete a criminal background check. Applicants who have committed a felony/misdemeanor may not be offered admission. The Board of Nursing may deny any application for licensure if the applicant has committed a felony/misdemeanor under laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia of the United States.
- Students must take and pass a drug screening test prior to starting clinical nursing courses. A positive drug screening test will prohibit students from starting clinical nursing courses.
- Applicants who have Honor Code violations will not be eligible for admission.
- There are limited seats available for transition students; no guarantee of class & clinical times.
- Students who are accepted to the program must participate in mandatory patient care clinical experiences and proof of the COVID-19 vaccine or a waiver request for exemption is currently required by clinical agencies.
- The P&HCC ADN Program has been granted full approval by the Virginia Board of Nursing. (<u>https://www.dhp.virginia.gov/Boards/Nursing</u>)
- The most recent accreditation decision made by the ACEN Board of Commissioners for the Associate Degree Nursing program is continuing accreditation with conditions. (See <u>Search Programs (acenursing.org)</u>.)
