

Patrick & Henry Community College Intermediate to Paramedic Associate of Applied Science Pathway

On successful completion of this program of study, students will be able to sit for the NREMT-Paramedic Cognitive Certification Examination, as well as earn an Associate of Applied Science - Paramedic from P&HCC. Students in this pathway will merge with the current EMT to Paramedic cohort during the First Year of the AAS-Paramedic Program.

Pre-Requisites for Application to Intermediate to Paramedic Pathway

- Graduated from high school or have a GED
- Must show evidence of high school or college Biology AND Chemistry with a C or better, OR completion of the BIO 141 Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) with a C or better
- GPA of 2.0 on previous P&HCC courses, or courses that have been transferred in from other institutions
- Current certification as an **Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate** in the Commonwealth of Virginia that must remain valid throughout the course
- Current certification in **American Heart Association CPR for BLS Providers** that must remain valid throughout the course

Paramedic Program Entrance Exam Information

- ALL EMS-Paramedic program applicants must complete an entrance exam to be ranked & accepted into the program. The exam evaluates basic math & reading comprehension skills & is a reliable predictor of the applicant’s readiness & capability for successful completion of the Paramedic program.
- Applicants must successfully complete the entrance exam with a minimum of 80% for math & reading on no more than two attempts. In the event an applicant has been denied entrance due to two unsuccessful attempts of the entrance exam, the applicant must wait until the next EMS-Paramedic application period to test again. Passing scores are only good for the current EMS application period.
- After submission of a EMS-Paramedic application during the published application period, qualified applicants will be invited to take the entrance exam. Please note qualified applicants are those that meet the outlined program application requirements. The cost of the exam is \$5 & is administered electronically from Platinum Education. Applicants will be provided an exam schedule with multiple dates & times the exam will be offered for the application period.

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- Applicants are encouraged to be prepared to complete simple math including addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions/proportions, decimals/percents, conversions, & some basic algebra, as well as be prepared to type a 125-word minimum essay on why a potential career path in Emergency Medical Services has been chosen.

Advanced Placement Information – Intermediate to Paramedic Pathway

- The EMS-Paramedic Program **does not give credit for Experiential Learning**. The Program does allow for **Advanced Placement credit**, as outlined below. The student is still responsible for the skill requirements of each Advanced Placement course & this could require additional time spent in lab/clinical opportunities.
- Current certification in **AHA BLS for Healthcare Providers** will allow for the student to be given credit for HLT 105 – Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation.
- Current certification in AHA ACLS, AHA PALS, NAEMT AMLS &/or NAEMT PHTLS can allow the student to be given credit for EMS 165, EMS 167, EMS 164, & EMS 163 respectively after skills verification in those disciplines by the EMS Program Director has been completed.
- Advanced Placement as a **Virginia EMT-Intermediate** into the AAS-Paramedic track **will require an EMS skills verification** by the EMS Program Director or designee before starting the Paramedic courses. Upon skill verification, the student will be awarded credit for the following courses:
